

Jordan School District LEA Parent and Family Engagement Policy

October 1, 2022 - October 30, 2025

1. Jordan School District will involve parents at Title I schools in the development of the Jordan District Title I Utah Grants plan through the following actions:
 - a. A parent representative from a Title I school shall always serve on the District Leadership Team, whose responsibility it is to jointly develop and review the Jordan District Title I Utah Grants.
 - b. A yearly review of the school-wide Title I plan will be completed (see Item 2 below) to address the needs of the Title I schools and will be included in the Jordan District plan.
 - c. The final Jordan District Title I Utah Grants Plan will be reviewed with a Title I Advisory Committee (see Item 2).
2. Jordan School District will involve parents in the process of school review and improvement, as well as an annual evaluation of the District Local Education Agency (LEA) and school Parent and Family Engagement policy, through the following actions:
 - a. A Title I Advisory Committee will be assembled yearly, composed of the following members:
 - i. Title I LEA Coordinator and Support Committee Members
 - ii. Title I School Administrators
 - iii. Title I School Instructional Coaches/Specialists
 - iv. Title I School Classroom Teachers
 - v. Title I School Parents (minimum 2 – recommend a School Community Council member)
 - b. The role of this advisory committee will be to review Title I school academic achievement and climate/culture data, the school-wide Title I plan, school goals and programs, Parent and Family Engagement policy, School Compact, and the Jordan District Title I Utah Grants Plan.
3. Jordan School District will provide support and technical assistance to aid schools in effectively implementing parent and family engagement activities and building the school's capacity for strong parent engagement, which increases student achievement, by:
 - a. Providing support and training for the school's Instructional Coaches/Specialists through on-site support and networking.
 - b. Implementing District programs and connecting to state agencies.
4. Jordan School District will incorporate parent and family engagement strategies that support learning, transition between home and school, and parenting needs through:
 - a. Ongoing establishment and support of Title I preschool programs as space and funding become available.
 - b. Accommodating activities that increase literacy, math, health & wellness, and social skills at home and in the community.
 - c. Providing support for parenting and life skills through ongoing classes in the Family Learning Center.
 - d. Removing barriers for parental participation (i.e. parents who are economically disadvantaged, disabled, immigrant, migrant, Limited English Proficient, or ethnic minority).
